Friends of Basingbourne Park as a group retained its top level 'Outstanding' classification in the "It's Your Neighbourhood" Category. This year we also entered FoBP in the slightly different "Our Community" category and secured a 'Silver Gilt' classification, which is a great first result for a first attempt.

Basingbourne park was also entered by Fleet Town Council in the "Small Parks" and "Small Conservation Area" categories. Last year we secured Silver

Gilt grading with our first entry, so we are thrilled that this year we've improved to the top, 'Gold' level classification in both categories.

Entering S&SE In Bloom is really useful for us as the judges have a great wealth of experience and provide ideas and suggestions for improvements, explaining what other similar groups & parks are doing elsewhere in the region. They are also a fresh set of eyes who point out issues which we may not have noticed or have just got used to. The judging gives both FoBP and FTC a focus to make improvements and a deadline to work towards. So a huge thanks to Will and Pauline for pulling together our submission and hosting the judges this year, and to all of you who have contributed to the group and the park in the last 12 months to make these possible. Thanks to Ben from FTC and all the Grounds Maintenance team for their work too.


5th Birthday Survey

Our Annual General Meeting was held at Crookham Baptist Church Hall with guest speaker Ken Sankey, a Basingstoke Canal Society volunteer and the skipper of the Society's John Pinkerton II canal trip boat.

Ken provided an interesting review of the history of the Canal, of more recent developments and of the challenges faced for the future. He was keen to emphasise that the Canal will not "always be there" without community support, and funding cuts

at the owning Councils mean it is probably at its greatest threat since it was reopened in the 8os. Family Bat Walk

He explained the anatomy of a bat, how bats find their food, how the detectors work and what types of bats we were likely to find. Unfortunately, due to the recent weather, there very few wild bats flying around, but the rescue bats made the whole evening worthwhile.

Heathland Interpretation Board

Thanks to a grant from Hampshire & IoW Community Foundation's 'Orchid Environmental Fund', we have been able to install an interpretation board in the main heathland. This explains a little about what you are likely to see and also what rare plants & animals you could find if you look a little harder.
