Thanks to all the Friends of Basingbourne members, friends and Girl Guides who turned out on Saturday to help with our Spring Clean Action Day. This was part of Fleet Town Council's Action Day. We had over 30 volunteers with ages ranging from 3 to over 70. A great variety of litter was collected. There was a particular focus

on the area around the Wickham entrance.

The woodwork on the recently installed picnic bench and pitch side bench was treated which should help to give them a longer working life. Various items including the notice boards and play equipment were washed down.

Despite the stream having been cleared out by Council contractors only a few weeks ago, most of the wood and logs which had been removed had already made their way back into the stream. So the FoBP team dragged the wood up to the Scout compound. The wood will be dried out and can then used for campfires later in the year.
