Young People Helping in the Park



Basingbourne Park has had lots of fantastic help from the local young people:

• The various sections of the Guides and Scouts regularly help with their working sessions. For example, they have built stumperies, helped opening up alternative foot paths, painted the park fences, helped install benches, cleared the ditches of logs and branches, helped clearing scrub from the heathland areas, and of course picked up litter.

• We have a young "Duke of Edinburgh" volunteer who regularly litter picks around the park and woods, particularly around the "youth" areas, like the shelter and picnic bench.

- Wonderwood Explorers meet in the woods and introduce young children to nature and the wonderful wildlife we have present in the park.
- The Fleet Wildlife Explorers held a joint volunteer session with FoBP, building two fantastic stumperies despite the mud & boggy conditions.

These are great collaborations and we are really pleased to be working with other local groups to protect the green space that we are so lucky to have in Basingbourne Park and Woods. Well done and thanks to everybody who has helped us with this wonderful teamwork.



Winter Volunteer Sessions



Many thanks to those who volunteered at our winter sessions, especially many of the North East Hampshire Ramblers Group who joined us. These concentrated on the Canalside woodland trails. Two new trails were created leading either side from the Wickham car park, meaning that one less bridge is required to get back to Basingbourne Park without getting soggy feet. There was

also further clearance of the Canalside trail from Coxheath Road canal bridge.

Lots of litter and historical fly tipping were removed from the area too. but unfortunately not all of it. We're now in discussion with Fleet Town Council and Vivid Housing to try and get the remainder cleared.

Some very shiny blue beetles were spotted, thought to be Alder Leaf Beetle (Agelastica alni) which were considered to be extinct in Britain, but are now making a come back. Whether this is to be celebrated is debatable, as they can cause unsightly defoliation.
